The Parish Council has agreed to trial publishing a 3 monthly newsletter and this is the first edition with the second one planned for the beginning of December 2014. Glass Recycling

During October the Borough Council will contact everyone to introduce doorstep collection of glass and an extended range of plastics that will be recycled. However your Parish Council has agreed to retain the glass recycling facility at the Village Hall. This provides a welcome income that is used towards the Fuel Allotment grants each winter. So PLEASE keep using the bottle banks so that the money will continue to be raised.

Textile Recycling

The Council has agreed to install a textile recycling facility in the Village Hall Car Park.

All textiles welcome – old sheets, towels etc as well as clothing.

The money raised will be spent in the village for the benefit of the community.

However the bins must be used for the company providing them to continue the service.

Look out for the new bins which will go in around week commencing 22nd September.
